CYCLE: secure cycle parking.

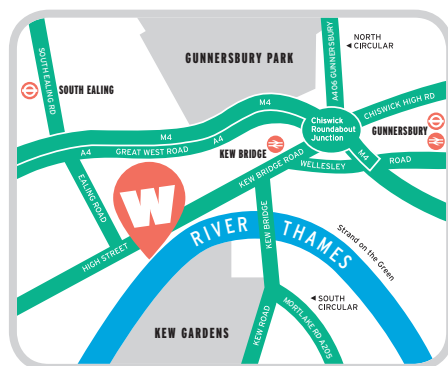
