Watermans is thrilled to announce its second year of Friday Nights Live with a brand new season for Spring 2020 that presents leading artists from an eclectic range of genres. On Fridays from 17 January 2020, audiences can choose from a range not to be found elsewhere in West London, including comedy, cabaret, digital performance, dance and talks.

The Friday Nights Live concept has been hugely popular with Watermans audiences who appreciate the quality that comes of events which are hand-picked by Watermans' team of programmers, and the affordable prices. The diversity of the programme means there's something for everyone, and every mood: it presents drag alongside contemporary dance, talks about black history alongside international digital performance, and circus alongside world music. And it works: audiences find events they know they'll love, but also get the chance to explore new experiences, something we know London audiences have a real appetite for.
